Congratulations on your qualification for the 2024 California High School Rodeo Association (CHSRA) State Finals Rodeo in Bishop, CA. The events that you have qualified in for the 2024 state finals are provided by your district secretary. All questions should be directed to your district secretary, before reaching out to anyone else.

<u>Please print and read this full entry packet and all of the information related to entries and the rodeo in general before accessing the online entry portal</u>. This important step will help you understand the details, deadlines and requirements which will save you time, additional fees and duplicated entries. Forgetting to enter an event or reserve stalls, camping, etc. will cause you to incur additional transactions with additional office fees which will not be refunded. Most all questions about the state finals rodeo can be answered by reading and referring to the informational packet.

Entries for the CHSRA State Finals rodeo are only taken via the on line portal. All entries, stalls, camping and payments will only be accepted via the online portal. The link to enter the entry system is included in your qualification email from your district secretary, as well as on the CHSRA website, www.chsra.com. Entries are open from May 7 through May 17 at 8:00 pm. Late entries will be accepted until May 18, 2024, 8:00 pm with a \$100 late fee.

In addition to entering online, you are required to submit the following 3 documents/pages via Google Forms on or before May 22, 2024. **\$25 Fine for late or incomplete paperwork**

- 1. Grade Verification Form/Concussion Protocol/Medical Release
- 2. Most Recent Report Card (**March** Mid Term Grade check for those who did not get progress reports or 3rd quarter report cards)
- 3. Bishop Gun Club Waiver for Shooting Sports Contestants only-Bring Original to Check in

If these items are not uploaded on or before the deadline, you will be assessed a \$25 fine for any late, incomplete, or missing paperwork. If your paperwork is not completed by May 29, you will be removed from the draw.



Rodeo Entry Procedures

Entries open on May 7 and close on May 17, 2024 at 8:00 pm(Late entries accepted through May 18 at 8:00 pm, with \$100 late fine)

2024 Entry Link

- Payments must be made at the time of entry with either Visa or MasterCard
- To avoid additional fees or multiple entries, PLEASE complete the sample entry planning form that is included in this packet. This step will help to ensure that you have all the necessary information ready for a smooth and complete entry process. Forgetting to enter an event, reserve stalls or purchase admission buttons will incur an additional transaction with additional office fees which will not be refunded. A \$25 administration fee will be added to any changes made to the original entry.

Required Documents-\$25 FINE FOR LATE OR INCOMPLETE PAPERWORK

You are required to upload the following printed and signed documents along with your Latest Report Card (or March Mid Term Grade Check) via Google Forms. (Link is found on <u>www.chsra.com</u>)

- Bishop Gun Club Release of Liability if entered in the shooting contests (bring original to Check in)

Rodeo Check -In: (refer to full rodeo schedule within the information packet)

CONTESTANTS MUST CHECK IN AT THE FIRST OPEN CHECK IN ONCE THEY ARRIVE ON THE GROUNDS

Check-in schedule: Saturday, June 8, 12pm-6pm (All Queen and shooting contestants must check in at this time) **Shooters must be checked in prior to practicing at the range.**

Sunday, June 9, 12:00 pm-6 pm

Monday, June 10, 9:00 am-12:00 pm AND 2:00pm-5:00pm

Tuesday, June 11, 9:00 am- 12:00 pm (All contestants must be checked in by NOON)

- Contestants are required to show membership cards at check-in
- Contestants must wear their district vest while checking in
- Contestants must attach their back number to their vest BEFORE leaving the building
- Contestants must be checked in by Tuesday, June 11 at Noon, or may be disqualified

Stall/Pen Rentals

All stalls/pens are reserved and paid for through the online entry portal. Please fill out requests on entry portal. These are the only requests that will be acknowledged. You must ALSO make sure to pay for stalls on your entry. Writing in the request box does not secure your stalling.

- Contestants may reserve the same number of stalls/pens as events qualified for (1 event=1 stall)
 - o Districts must submit names of contestants who are bringing haze horses and turn back horses
 - Those members must purchase the stalls on their entry
- Attempts are made to fulfill requests but are not guaranteed. Box stalls are divided equally among districts.
- Only one horse is allowed per stall/pen
- STALLS MAY NOT BE USED AT TACK ROOMS
- All stalls/pens come with one bale of shavings

CHSRA 2024 High School State Final

- Stallions must be in a box stall-reserved on entry as STALL-STALLION BOX, and state in request box
- Mandatory stall/pen cleaning information: Bring your own supplies, no cleaning tools on site
 - All pens and box stalls must be completely cleaned out of shavings and waste dumped in roll off bins. If your stall is not cleaned out upon your departure, you will be charged \$200 and deemed a member not in good standing (take a picture when you are done)
- Extra stalls beyond the number of events qualified may be available after May 26
- DO NOT SHOW UP AT THE GATE WITH HORSES THAT YOU HAVE NOT RESERVED A STALL FOR

Camping-Gates will open on SATURDAY, JUNE 8 AT 8:00 AM- DO NOT ARRIVE ON FRIDAY

Camping reservations are made and paid for through the online entry portal. <u>Each FAMILY is allowed to</u> <u>reserve ONE hookup camping site</u>. Additional sites may be available AFTER MAY 26, for an additional charge. The length of your trailer is required to help plan

- If you plan to camp as a group, you must arrive together-Plan to wait in the parking lot until your whole group arrives
- Staff and volunteers will park you. Be respectful and courteous-Contestants are held accountable for parent/guardian actions
- RV or Trailer-\$250 per site with water and electricity. Septic pumping will be every other day (M/W/F or T/TH/Sa)
- Dry/Tent Camping-\$100 this space is unlimited. There is no limit on dry camping
- Longer trailers may be parked in a different area-PLEASE include length to help in our planning
- Horses are not allowed in the camping areas. Make arrangements to transport tack to the barn/stalls
- Tents are not allowed to take a Trailer/RV in main campground
- Fire lanes in campground must be kept clear, no vehicles should be parked within the trailers
- You must clean up after yourself at your campsite. You will be charged if trash is left at your site

NO OPEN FIRES

No open flame fire pits or BBQ permitted per the state Fire Marshall. Propane fire pits and charcoal BBQs are allowed


Personal Motorized Vehicles

No personal motorized vehicles are permitted on the Tri County Fairgrounds. This includes but is not limited to motorcycles, ATVs, motorized scooters, motorized bikes, and motorized gas or e-assist type vehicles are allowed on the grounds. Contestants will be disqualified if a family member, friend or contestant is using one. Handicapped access or special circumstances can be requested by emailing Jen Fleming, secretarychsra@gmail.com

The only exceptions are motorized wheelchairs.

Jim Usher Memorial Shooting Contest

Sunday, June 9, 2024 at 8:00 am at the Bishop Gun Club, 3949 North Sierra Highway, Bishop, CA (See Jim Usher Memorial Shooting Contest Flyer for more information) Any member in good standing may enter the light rifle or trap event at CHSRA State Finals, you do not have to qualify for either of these events at the district level. Automobiles/Trucks on Fairgrounds Property

Only licensed drivers are allowed to operate registered vehicles on the fairgrounds. Public traffic laws are applicable within the fairgrounds. Unlicensed drivers are NOT allowed to drive on the fairgrounds for any reason. If unlicensed drivers are observed driving anywhere on the fairgrounds, they will be automatically disqualified. Please drive slowly everywhere on the grounds as there are contestants, bikes and family members walking throughout the grounds. Parking while riding, competing or watching is not permitted in the barns. You may stop in the barns to unload feed or tack but must park outside in the asphalt parking lot. Gates will be closed to vehicles 30 minutes prior to the start of each performance and open back up 30 minutes after each performance. This will be during the morning slack and evening performances, as well as cutting and RCH, so plan accordingly.

Dress Code

Please be aware of the areas where full western attire is required for both contestants and associate members, as the dress code will be enforced per CHSRA and NHSRA expectations and rules.

- Contestants must be in rodeo dress code during the rodeo, whether in the arena or in the grandstands (See Contestant Disqualification, rule a. Attire-Page 28 of NHSRA Rule Book)
- Associate members must be in dress code while helping contestants in or near the arena. (If you are at an in or out gate, stripping chute, bucking chute or roping boxes, YOU MUST BE IN WESTERN ATTIRE
- All contestants are required to wear their district vest and rodeo back number for the duration of the State Finals rodeo, whether at the fairgrounds or in the community


- Contestants are required to attend in full western attire
- Parents are STRONGLY encouraged to attend
- Student and adult event directors are introduced at the meeting
- District Team Pictures and District All Around Pictures immediately following the meeting

Contestant Welcome BBQ

Tuesday, June 11, 2024- The Bishop Chamber of Commerce hosts a free welcome dinner for all of the CHSRA contestants and their families. RSVPs are required so that the Chamber can plan accordingly. Please attend and thank the generous supporters of our State Finals rodeo. There will be raffle prizes and during this dinner our district queens are introduced as well as our Calcutta team auction.

Student Officer Elections

Students must fill out the <u>application</u> to nominate themself. Applications are due MAY 12. Once applications are submitted and students have received verification from Patsy Pachie, students may begin campaigning on social media on May 24 and plan a display for check in and may display posters around the fairgrounds for the duration of the rodeo. Voting will take place in the rodeo office June 12-14.



Dance Rules

- \$5 admission per person
- Snacks and water will be provided, no outside food or drinks are allowed
- If a contestant leaves the dance, they will not be allowed back in
- Inappropriate, lewd or lascivious dancing will constitute removal from the dance and will result in meeting with the disciplinary committee the following morning (Leave room for Jesus)
- Any contestant participant suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be removed from the dance, with local law enforcement, contestant's parents, district presidents and state executive board notified. Contestant will be automatically disqualified and will be asked to leave the rodeo grounds.
- Contestants are required to wear their district vests and back numbers at all dances
- Semi formal attire is required for Cowboy Prom, contestant vests must be worn through the door, but may by taken off once inside
- Each CHSRA State Finals contestant may bring one student guest. The guest must be registered with the rodeo secretary and will be issued a back number. Guests must follow all CHSRA contestant rules and dress code regulations. Contestants are responsible for the guest's behavior, and can be disqualified for their guest's behavior

Disciplinary Committee


This committee made up of the state board and district presidents (or designated representative) will meet 1 hour before each rodeo performance to discuss any behavior infractions (or rule violations outside of the arena competition rules) that arise with contestants, parents or family members. On Monday and Saturday, a representative from District 1, 4, and 7 shall be part of the committee. On Tuesday and Friday, districts 2, 5, and 8 will be represented, and on Wednesday and Thursday, districts 3, 6, and 9 will serve on the committee. If a contestant is asked to meet with the disciplinary committee, the member shall have the district president or adult high school representative present during the meeting as an advocate for the member. Please see attached Disciplinary Committee description for more details

Dogs at Fairgrounds

All dogs must be on a leash at all times while on the fairgrounds property. Please clean up after your pets and dispose of their waste in trash receptables. <u>Dogs are not allowed in the grandstands for</u> the safety of all spectators, so please plan accordingly.

Adult Conduct during CHSRA State Finals Rodeo

As a reminder, we are all on site to support and celebrate our student athletes' opportunities to compete and enjoy their state finals. Therefore, no alcoholic beverages are allowed outside of individual campsites. No alcohol is allowed in the contestant area (grandstands, arena, roping boxes, bucking chutes, etc) All of the state finals volunteers are fellow parents so please do not put anyone in an awkward position requiring them to have to address another parent about inappropriate behavior or alcohol use in a restricted area.



Awards Ceremony

The awards ceremony will be held on Saturday, June 15 after the short go. Awards are given to the top 10 in each event and based on the aggregate of the 2 long rounds and the short round. State finals event champions are determined by the lowest aggregate time or the highest total scores regardless of the total points in the events. The national finals qualifying team will be announced at the awards ceremony. You must declare Saturday, BEFORE the start of the awards ceremony if you plan to attend the NHSFR in Rock Springs in July. National Team Picture will be taken immediately following awards ceremony

CHSRA All-Around Cowboy and Cowgirl

State all around awards are based ONLY on the CHSRA state finals rodeo. No points shall be carried in from the districts. See attached point table for All Around Point System for 2024 CHSRA State Finals

National Finals Qualifier Team Meeting(Top 4 contestants in each event)

- A mandatory contestant and parent meeting for all National Qualifiers will be held Sunday, June 16 at 9 am
- If your contestant qualifies for the NHSFR, you will need to notify Jen Fleming before the awards if you choose to decline the entry to NHSFR
- The NHSFR is July 13-20 in Rock Springs, WY
- <u>ALL National Finals Rodeo paperwork and payment must be completed and turned in at this meeting. Some of the paperwork must be notarized so please have your government ID with you. Notaries will be available on site</u>
- NHSFR camping, stalling and golf cart rental will be paid with paperwork
- If you would like to complete any/all of the CHSRA paperwork ahead of time, it will be available on the CHSRA website in advance of the CHSRA finals rodeo.
- Payment must be made when paperwork is completed. Cash, check or credit cards are accepted. Credit cards will have a 3% processing fee

- Any CHSRA member in good standing may enter and compete in the shooting matches.
- Members must enter using the online entry form, as with all other state finals events. Entries close on the same date as all other state finals events, no sign ups will be held at the rodeo.
- Contestant vest and back number must be worn at all times.
- Contestants must provide rifle and ammunition meeting requirements for this competition.
- Eye and ear protection is mandatory for all competitors while on the firing line.
- Any firearms displayed or brandished in public or at the Fairgrounds will result in disqualification from the CHSRA State Finals Rodeo.
- For Light Rifle Competition Rules, please visit the CHSRA web site at <u>www.chsra.com</u> and download the "National High School Rodeo Shooting Sports Guide."
 - New for 2024: All competitors and other personnel in the immediate vicinity of the range complex must wear eye protection devices. Must show the ANSI Z87.1 (and/or the equivalent standard for all countries involved) safety rating for eye protection devices
 - \circ It is your responsibility to read and understand the rules. Many clarifications were made in January
 - Long sleeve, button up shirt is required as dress code
- Range is located approximately 5 miles from Tri-County Fairgrounds.

CONCUSSION INFORMATION SHEET

This sheet has information to help protect your children or teens from concussion or other serious brain injury. Use this information at your children's or teens' rodeo, events and practices to learn how to spot a concussion and what to do if a concussion occurs.

WHAT IS A CONCUSSION?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury—or TBI—caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move quickly back and forth. This fast movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, creating chemical changes in the brain and sometimes stretching and damaging the brain cells.

HOW CAN I SPOT A POSSIBLE CONCUSSION?

Children and teens who show or report one or more of the signs and symptoms listed below—or simply say they just "don't feel right" after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body—may have a concussion or other serious brain injury.

SIGNS OBSERVED BY PARENTS, DIRECTORS OR JUDGES

- Appears dazed or stunned.
- Forgets their turn, is confused about the rodeo or is unsure of an event, time, or score.
- Moves clumsily.
- Answers questions slowly.
- Loses consciousness (even briefly).
- Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes.
- Can't recall events prior to or after a hit or fall.

SYMPTOMS REPORTED BY CHILDREN AND TEENS

- Headache or "pressure" in head.
- Nausea or vomiting.
- Balance problems or dizziness, or double or blurry vision. Bothered by light or noise.
- Feeling sluggish, hazy, foggy, or groggy.
- Confusion, or concentration or memory problems.
- Just not "feeling right," or "feeling down."





WHAT ARE SOME MORE SERIOUS DANGER SIGNS TO LOOK OUT FOR?

In rare cases, a dangerous collection of blood (hematoma) may form on the brain after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body and can squeeze the brain against the skull. Call 9-1-1 or take your child or teen to the emergency department right away if, after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body, he or she has one or more of these danger signs:

- One pupil larger than the other.
- Drowsiness or inability to wake up.
- A headache that gets worse and does not go away.
- Slurred speech, weakness, numbness, or decreased coordination.
- Repeated vomiting or nausea, convulsions or seizures (shaking or twitching).
- Unusual behavior, increased confusion, restlessness, or agitation.
- Loss of consciousness (passed out/knocked out). Even a brief loss of consciousness should be taken seriously.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD OR TEEN HAS A POSSIBLE CONCUSSION?

As a parent, if you think your child or teen may have a concussion, you should:

- 1. Remove your child or teen from the rodeo.
- 2. Keep your child or teen out of their events the day of the injury. Your child or teen should be seen by a health care provider and only return to competition with permission from a health care provider who is experienced in evaluating for concussion.
- 3. Ask your evaluating health care provider for written release instructions for your child or teen return to rodeo competition.

Do not try to judge the severity of the injury yourself. Only a health care provider should assess a child or teen for a possible concussion. Concussion signs and symptoms often show up soon after the injury. But you may not know how serious the concussion is at first, and some symptoms may not show up for hours or days.

The brain needs time to heal after a concussion. A child's or teen's return to rodeo practice and competition should be a gradual process that is carefully managed and monitored by a health care provider.

HOW CAN I HELP KEEP MY CHILDREN OR TEENS SAFE?

Rodeo is a great way for children and teens to stay healthy and can help them do well in school. To help lower your children's or teens' chances of getting a concussion or other serious brain injury, you should:

- Help create a culture of safety for the team.
 - >> Teach ways to lower the chances of getting a concussion.

» Talk with your children or teens about concussions and ask if they have concerns about reporting a concussion. Talk with them about their concerns; emphasize the importance of reporting concussions and taking time to recover from one.

- >> Ensure that they follow the CHSRA/NHSRA rules for safety and the rules of the sport.
- >> Tell your children or teens that you expect them to practice good sportsmanship at all times.
- When appropriate for their events, teach your children or teens that wearing a helmet can lower the chances of the most serious types of brain or head injury. However, there is no "concussion-proof" helmet. So, even with a helmet, it is important for children and teens to avoid hits to the head.

Disciplinary Action

CHSRA shall have the right and responsibility to enforce the rules of the National High School Rodeo Association. Action taken may include disqualification, censure, probation, removal, suspension or expulsion. Disciplinary action shall be authorized against any member, contestant, parents or guardian of members or contestants, or any member of the public attending a national, state/province rodeo, district qualifying rodeo or CHSRA sanctioned function. A member or contestant may be subject to all disciplinary procedures due to action of parent or guardian. In the event that an issue must come before the disciplinary committee, the contestant shall be notified as soon as possible by the person or persons disqualifying the Contestant.

The contestant must have his or her district adult representative with him or her at the meeting. Parents and guardians are not allowed at the hearings.

The following disciplinary committee structure has been established for High School State Finals for 2024:

This committee of state board and district presidents (or designated representative) will meet 1 hour prior to each rodeo performance to discuss any rule violations (outside of the arena competition rules) that arise with contestants, parents or family members. On Monday and Saturday, a representative from districts 1,4 and 7 shall be part of the committee, along with members present from the CHSRA Executive Board. On Tuesday and Friday, districts 2,5 and 8 will be representatives, and on Wednesday and Thursday, districts 3,6 and 9 will serve on the committee. If a member is asked to meet with the disciplinary committee, the member shall have the district president or adult high school representative present during the meeting as an advocate for the member.

If the president or designated representative are serving on the committee, another appointed representative (so long as the representative is not the parent or guardian of member) shall stand in with the member as their advocate.

Contestant Disqualification

Please make sure to read and fully understand pages 34-38 of the 2022-2024 NHSRA Rule Book. This section refers to all ways a contestant could be disqualified from the rodeo competition. It is your responsibility to be familiar with the different offences that could result in disqualification from the 2024 CHSRA State Finals Rodeo. The following section is regarding conduct, and association with substances that will result in immediate disqualification: page 36, #7 a (1):

Having any association with alcoholic beverages, vaping, marijuana products, tobacco products, and narcotic or other nonmedicinal drugs while in attendance at any approved High School Rodeo, whether at a motel or on the rodeo grounds or going to or from the rodeo or at any rodeo function. Contestants will be disqualified for the use of those products.

Social Media

In accordance with the NHSRA rules for contestant disqualification under Conduct (3): Conduct or speech of any kind detrimental to the best interest of the National High School Rodeo Association or the sport of rodeo while in attendance or coming to and going home from a rodeo, CHSRA has expanded this to all platforms of social media. Any negative speech regarding NHSRA, CHSRA, the facilities, volunteers, staff, business associated with or member of the CHSRA State Finals Rodeo will result in automatic disqualification from the 2024 State Finals Rodeo and the possible suspension for the 2024-2025 rodeo season. The social media policy will extend to any photographs or videos posted on any social media platform that shows the contestant's association with alcoholic beverages, vaping products, marijuana products, tobacco products and narcotic or other non-medicinal drugs while in attendance at any approved High School Rodeo, whether at a motel or on rodeo grounds or going to or from the rodeo or at any rodeo function. Contestants will be automatically disqualified from the 2024 CHSRA State Finals rodeo and the possible suspension from the 2024-2025 rodeo season.

If a contestant is disqualified from the 2024 CHSRA State Finals, the contestant will forfeit any placings, points, awards, monies and/or scholarships that have been awarded.

Page 6 of the NHSRA Rule Book states: (10) Disciplinary action(s): Any member of a State/Province Association, student or adult who: a) fails to comply with the requirements and standards for members contained in the Rules, By-laws and Constitution or Policy Statements of the Association as adopted by the National Board of Directors or the National Executive Committee; b) engages in the acts of insubordination, serious misconduct association with alcohol, narcotic or other non-medicinal drugs or acts which are detrimental to the reputation, principles and interests of the Association; c) engages in conduct constituting grounds for disqualification from any event or function as provided in the NHSRA rules; or d) any other acts specified hereafter, shall be subject to the Disciplinary Action provided below. Violation of any of the provisions of the Rules, By-laws and Constitution by the parents or guardians of a student member of the NHSRA will subject the student member to all levels of the Disciplinary Action provided herein. 

On behalf of myself, my family members, guests, heirs, agents, assigns, beneficiaries, executors and administrators, and for the consideration of being allowed to enter and use the BGC Facility and services of BGC, and for other valuable considerations, I, do hereby absolutely and unequivocally agree to release, indemnify, save, hold harmless and defend BGC, its Officers, Board Members, Match Directors, Members, sponsors, agents, employees, instructors, assigns and successors in interest, from any and all claims, demands, debts, obligations, liabilities, costs, expenses, rights of action, causes of action and judgments of any kind or character whatsoever (whether claimed by myself or another person or entity) which may arise out of any loss, damage, injury or death which I, my family members, my guests or any third parties may, or do, sustain while on the BGC premises caused by my use, or any third party use of the BGC Facility including the discharge of firearms.
